*The Jesup Police Department strives to improve services, and provide the highest quality law enforcement services utilizing the most effective methods of delivery with limited resources. We continue to utilize eclectic methods in crime analysis, community-based programs, technology and enforcement to make our community the safest place to live. According to 2011 records furnished by the Wayne County E-911 Records Management System; the past year has shown a reduction in calls for service, which include motor vehicle accidents, incident reports, and traffic violations.*

*Our community-based programs including: The Behind the Badge Television Show, Community Safety Programs, Education and Enforcement, working in collaboration with other agencies and the community have made an impact on increasing the quality of life for the citizens in Jesup. For example, the first annual Public Safety Day was a tremendous success due to all of the public service agencies and community coming together to demonstrate all the resources available in our community. Also, The Jesup Police Department Drug Free Program was implemented this year to train*

*and mentor our youth in the school system about the dangers of drug abuse. This program was coordinated and designed by our agency to educate and reduce drug use in our youth. Officers in our Special Operations Division spent months researching the most effective teaching methods for law enforcement based on scientific empirical evidence backed by federal studies. Several of our dedicated officers are involved in teaching this program.*

*The City Marshal's duties have increased and evolved to include: monitoring of business licenses and ensuring better licensing procedures; recruiting of personnel; and providing more safety seminars, in addition to detective's requirements.*

*The Jesup Police Department continues to receive the COPS Grant for personnel, and also received a Local Law Enforcement Services (LLES) Grant in the amount of \$9,954.00 to up-grade our police radars.*

*The Jesup Police Department's goals for this coming year is to fill staffing vacancies with the highest quality personnel, and re-activate our Aggressive Criminal Enforcement (ACE) team, which concentrates on specific crime problems or community issues.*

*I would like to congratulate everyone in Jesup and Wayne County both civilian and professional alike on all our past combined accomplishments and look forward to many more in the upcoming year. I want to thank all of my fellow Jesup Police Department members for their excellent service over the past year and I thank you community for allowing me to serve as your Chief of Police. Together we will continue to make Jesup and Wayne County a safer place to live.*

# JESUP POLICE DEPARTMENT

## OPERATIONS DIVISION



The Jesup Police Department is broken up into divisions. Captain Lawrence Moseley oversees the first three divisions of the Jesup Police Department as well as the Animal Control Division. The Community Relations Division is directly under the Chief of Police. At the end of 2011 there were 24 members of the Jesup Police Department both civilian and officers combined.

Each Division is supervised by a Lieutenant who reports back to Capt. Moseley with division updates. Captain Moseley keeps the Chief of Police up-to-date and informed on all activity within the Department. Captain Moseley is the Hiring Process Coordinator, handles Emergency Management, Procurement, and assists with GCIC Records, Grants, State Certification, and Personnel Management. Captain Moseley is directly over the Animal Control Division, which is comprised of two uniformed patrol officers. The Jesup Police Department divisions are as follows:

1. Administrative Division
2. Patrol Division
3. Special Operations Division
  - a. Investigations Unit
  - b. Internal Affairs Department
  - c. Drug Intervention
  - d. Gang Suppression
4. Community Relations
5. Animal Control



## Administrative Division


During the 2011 fiscal year, Lt. Mike Lane served as Patrol Lieutenant for the Jesup Police Department. Lt. Lane also assisted Captain Lawrence Moseley with the day-to-day Administrative duties. He assisted with over seeing personnel files; ordering of all equipment and supplies, grant applications, vehicle maintenance, and specking and bidding of all equipment. He worked with officers to ensure they had the necessary equipment to perform their duties as a police officer. Lt. Lane is also in charge of all firearms, Use of Force, Legal Updates, and Taser training for the department. He and Lt. Alex Reddish were also responsible for working with the Georgia Department of Transportation for permits to shut down state routes during any parade ceremonies. Lt. Lane was responsible for ensuring all radar equipment was calibrated annually as required by state law.

During each year, Lt. Lane trains officers in firearms four times a year, or once every quarter. Each time officers go to the Firing Range they must qualify with their service weapon and also receive specialized training to continue the improvement of their firearm skills. Officers give great feedback from the extra training provided as a wide range of skills can be covered during these times. Once a year, Lt. Lane provides in-service training on Use of Force, Legal Updates, and Taser. All officers are currently certified in the use of the M-26 Taser as a less than lethal weapon. In December of 2011, Lt. Lane held an Active Shooter Training Class at the Wayne County High School for all Certified Officers within the department. Lt. Lane and Lt. Reddish were also responsible for registering all officers for training classes offered by the Georgia Public Training Center in Forsyth, GA. Lt. Lane made sure all necessary paperwork was completed and filed for any new hires with the Jesup Police Department. He also oversaw all new officer approval and acceptance into the Police Academy for training.

## GRANTS

During the year Lt. Lane was responsible for quarterly reporting of the Federal COPS grant. This grant was awarded to the Jesup Police Department to provide salary and benefits for the hiring of one officer for a three-year period. The total grant award was \$138,286.00. Officer Gerald Ryan Long was hired under this grant on 07/13/2009. Upon the resignation of Officer Long, Officer Chris Hamilton filled this spot to continue with the grant. So far, a total of \$107,242.88 has been paid to the City of Jesup for this Officer's salary and benefits. There is a remaining balance of \$31,043.12 to be paid to the City of Jesup over the course of this grant.



Lt. Lane also oversees the reporting of the Bullet Proof Vest Partnership Grant, which pays 50% of bulletproof vest purchases made by the Jesup Police Department. During 2011 Lt Lane applied for more funds to be issued under this grant and the Jesup Police Department was awarded a \$3,787.50 grant with a \$3,787.50 match from the Federal Government for a total of grant amount of \$7,575.00. The Police Department is carrying over a balance of federal funds in the amount of \$1,120.00 from the 2010 grant award, bringing the total Federal Grant to \$4,907.50 for the 2011 fiscal year. The 50% match by the Police Department will bring the grant total to \$9,815.00. Two (2) replacement vests with tactical carriers were ordered for Officer Manning and Officer Brown on 09/23/2011 for \$1,320.00 and received on 11/01/2011. Two (2) replacement vests with tactical carriers were ordered for Lt. Lane and Lt. Reddish on 11/28/2011 for \$1,320.00 and received on 01/05/2012. A request for payment for these four vests has been submitted in the amount of \$1,320.00. Once payment is received for these vest for Police Department will carry over a balance of \$3,587.50 in federal grant money to 2012. The 50% match by the Police Department will leave a balance of \$7,175.00 to carry over to the 2012 fiscal year.

In November of 2011, Lt. Lane applied for another federal grant titled Law Enforcement Service Grant. This grant was a 90% grant with a local match of 10%. The maximum grant amount an agency could apply for under this grant was \$10,000.00 with a local match of \$1,000.00 totaling \$11,000.00. The grant was submitted requesting the purchase of five (5) Genesis II K-Bank Dual Antenna Directional Radars. The radar units were priced out at \$2,190.00 each including installation. The total grant amount was \$10,950.00. In December of 2011 the Police Department received an award letter for this grant for the full amount of \$10,950.00. The federal grant award amount is \$9,954.55 (90%) with a local match of \$995.45 (10%) for a total of \$10,950.00. The Police Department is currently in the process of ordering this equipment to fulfill the grant requirements.

## **JESUP POLICE DEPARTMENT** **PATROL DIVISION**

Lieutenants Alex Reddish and Mike Lane have continued to command the Uniform Patrol Division for 2011. The JPD Patrol Officers have maintained a continued vigilance in keeping our streets safer for our citizens. One way this was accomplished was in active participation in the GOHS “Click It or Ticket” Campaigns and “Operation Zero Tolerance” Campaigns throughout the year. During all GOHS Campaigns the Jesup Police Department actively targeted seatbelt violators, aggressive drivers, super speeders, and impaired drivers. During 2011 officers issued a total of 408 seatbelt citations and worked 49 DUI cases. On September 16<sup>th</sup> Lt. Alex Reddish and Officers performed a Seatbelt Safety Check at James E. Bacon Elementary School (issued 6 warnings), Martha Puckett Middle School (issued 7 warnings) and the Wayne County High School (issued 15 warnings). On September 19<sup>th</sup> Lt. Mike Lane and Officers performed a Seatbelt Safety Check at Jesup Elementary School (issued 16 adult warnings & 39 student warnings), Martha Rawls Smith Elementary School (issued 11 adult warnings & 16 student warnings), and Arthur Williams Middle School (issued 21 adult warnings & 18 student warnings). The Jesup Police Department teamed up with the Wayne County Sheriff’s Office, and the Georgia State Patrol DUI Task Force to schedule several random, unannounced road checks throughout the county.



## 2011 Traffic / Non-Traffic Citation Violations



The Jesup Police Department has made a total of **1,629 adult** arrests according to the Wayne County Jail records for citations and criminal offenses together for 2011. There were 131 new inmates booked into the Wayne County Jail for JPD each month, which averaged out to approximately 4 new arrests per day.

There were **64 Juvenile** arrests for the Police Department.

## ACCIDENT REPORTS




Though 2011 showed a total of 510 accidents within the Jesup City limits, this number is down from last year's total of 668. Out of those accidents there were a total of 28 incidents resulting in injuries.

The Jesup Police Department recorded a total of 67 Hit & Run accident reports last year in addition to the total above which is down from 85 for 2010.

## CITY MARSHAL / COMMUNITY RELATIONS

2011 has proven to be a productive year for Marshal Glenn Jackson. Throughout the year the City Marshall has carried out several duties on a daily basis such as duties involving city ordinances such as abandoned vehicles, trashy lots, business licenses, taxi cab inspections, reviewing and issuing taxi permits, assisting the Building Inspector Truitt

Thompson with city ordinance violators by issuing citations, assisting the Water Department, etc. In addition to his daily duties at City Hall and his continued diligence in enforcing City Ordinances, Marshal Jackson has hosted several safety programs and events through out the year. He participated on the promotion board for Glynn County Police Department in January. Cracker Williams Rec. Department Job Fair, the Literacy Program held at James E. Bacon Elementary school gym, and the Safe Kids of Georgia Child Safety Seat Check kept him busy throughout February. Marshal Jackson participated in a safety day event for Hospice of South Georgia as well as a safety day event for the WCHS in conjunction with Safe Kids of Georgia and Family Connections during the month of May. He participated in a Mock Interview activity that was held for the F.C.I. Inmates and also attended the Mental Health Gala in representation of the Jesup Police Department. 2011 found Marshal Jackson appearing on several Behind the Badge episodes, assisting Det. Greg Rozier with safety skits and providing safety tip information for viewers. He attended monthly meetings with Family Connections and Safe Kids of Wayne County. He assisted with the 2011 Arch Fest and Mud Bog. On September 17<sup>th</sup> Marshal Jackson participated in Public Safety Day by working the Operation Pill Drop Booth. October 8<sup>th</sup> found Marshal Jackson participating in Safety Day at Kmart. Red Hill Baptist Church hosted Marshal Jackson on October 13<sup>th</sup> as he presented a Scam Program for the Gentlemen members church with a total of 16 attendees. Marshal Jackson on October 18<sup>th</sup> at the Chamber of Commerce Lunch & seminar that was held at A.T.C. The seminar covered Shoplifting and Internal Theft with twenty-one (21) attendees. The Downtown Development Authority hosted Open House in November with the assistance of Marshal Jackson. Newly employed taxi drivers must a Taxi Permit from the Jesup Police Department. All applicants are reviewed and approved by Marshal Jackson. During 2011 there were a total of sixteen permits issued to new drivers. Part of the Jesup Police Department hiring process includes a thorough background investigation of each applicant, which is also handled by Marshal Jackson. There were a total of twelve (12) background investigations for new JPD hires completed during 2011. Marshal Jackson also presented a booth at the Ogeechee Tech Job Fair in



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Statesboro on behalf of the Jesup Police Department this past year. Now that 2011 is behind him, Marshal Jackson is looking ahead to what he can accomplish in 2012 to further assist the citizens of the City of Jesup.

## **Jesup Police Department Recruiting Team**

The important task of getting out to the schools and colleges to find the best and brightest of the upcoming candidates for the Jesup Police Department has been given to Officers Chris Hamilton and Nick Ellis. 



# GANG INVESTIGATIONS



O.C.G.A 16-15-2 Legislative findings and intent  
(emphasis added)

The general assembly however, further find that the state of Georgia is in a state of crisis which has been caused by violent criminal street gangs whose members threaten, terrorize, and commit a multitude of crimes against the peaceful citizens of their neighborhoods. These activities both individually and collectively present a clear and present danger to public order and safety and are not constitutionally protected.

O.C.G.A 16-15-3(2) (emphasis added) "Criminal Street Gang" means

1. Any organization, association, or group of three or more person
2. Associated in fact , whether formal or informal,
3. Which engages in criminal gang activity as defined in

O.C.G.A 16-15-3(1)

The existence of such organization, association, or group of individual associated in fact may be established by evidence of

1. A common name
2. Common identifying signs, symbols, tattoos, graffiti, or attire
3. Other distinguishing characteristic including but not limited to  
common activities, customs or behaviors.

The Jesup Police Department has recognized that we have a current criminal street gang problem. Many thefts and community disturbances were reported to be started by some type of gang related activity. All reported activity has been documented. The City of Jesup has not experienced some of the activity our surrounding cities such as Baxley, Hinesville, Brunswick, and Savannah are experiencing, but there is still a need to provide the training for someone to "Record It, Report It, and Remove It", the 3 R's that reminds our citizens to take control of their community.

In July of 2011 The Jesup Police Department joined forces with the Georgia Gang Investigators Association, which allowed Officer Nick Ellis to attend several training conferences sponsored by the US District Attorney's Office. Officer Nick Ellis has completed the 40 hour Gang Investigator Course and is currently serving as a Georgia Gang Investigator for the Jesup Police Department while working his duties as a patrolman. He currently attends monthly Intel meetings provided by Savannah Metro Police Department, The Chatham County Department of Juvenile Justice and Applying County Sheriff's Office and DFCS where information is traded, processed, and investigated to determine connections and possible suspects for unsolved cases. By doing this Officer Ellis has assisted other counties and departments by providing information from Internet sources (Facebook, MySpace, twitter) and public schools. Officer Ellis, along with his fellow patrolmen, has labeled and documented five of the most common gangs which are Bloods, Crips, Folk, Latin Kings, and Vice Lords, and ten hybrid gangs which consist of the different sets of the 5 most commons gangs mixing together to create criminal street gang activity such as criminal trespass, tagging, drug activity and weapon possessions right here in our city. ## DETECTIVES DIVISION

The Jesup Police Department Detectives Division has been extremely busy for 2011. Det./Lt. Morgan and Det./Sgt. Rozier have made a combined total of approximately 200 cases from January thru December. Just a few of the cases handled were Armed Robbery, Theft by Taking, Child Molestation, Forgery, Financial Transaction Fraud, Theft by Deception, Entering Autos, Statutory Rape, Unlawful Acts, Affray, False Report of a Crime, Enticing a Child, and Shoplifting. Combined efforts have resulted in a total of 78 cases solved with 86 total arrests made for these cases. Of all the cases handled by the Detectives Division during 2011, the most memorable case is a double shooting that occurred toward the end of 2011. The suspect was apprehended just hours after the incident took place. The suspect was charged with Armed Robbery, two (2) counts of Aggravated Assault, two (2) counts of Aggravated Battery, and Possession of a Firearm/Knife during the Commission of a Crime. The suspect is currently being held at the Wayne County Jail waiting for trial. Both victims involved have made a full recovery.


### *P.olice A.nd C.ommunity T.gether* **P.A.C.T.**

The Jesup Police Department has continued to utilize the Police and Community Together (P.A.C.T.) program for the year of 2011. With the P.A.C.T. program City of Jesup citizens are encouraged to call in any concerns they feel need to be addressed by the Jesup Police Department. Concerns include but are not limited to domestic disputes, unruly children, reckless driving, and any suspicious activity. A P.A.C.T. activity report is released once every two weeks to the local Media for the general public. It provides information as to what areas will be monitored for that specific week as well as any specific violations or concerns that will be addressed. It also provides the contact numbers for the Jesup Police Department, The Crime Watch Hot line, and the Illegal Drug Activity Line to be utilized by all citizens.





Lesson plans are obtained from the NIDA (National Institute for Drug Abuse). Each presentation will be grade/age specific so as to be as informative and comprehensive as possible. Funds for the program are raised through t'shirt sales and donations. The Jesup Police Department is excited to be a part of this new program and is expecting excellent results in the upcoming year!



## JESUP POLICE DEPARTMENT MUNICIPAL COURT

The Municipal Court for the City of Jesup Police Department holds court on the second Monday of each month. The Jesup Police Department Municipal Court is proud to have Judge Joseph L. Phelps III presiding. Municipal Court is overseen by Lt. Mike Lane and Lt. Alex Reddish. All Uniformed Patrol officers attend each court session. Each officer acts as an escort for individuals from the courtroom to the front office after sentencing. There are approximately 275 cases assigned for each court date. Each court session is recorded on audiotape for future reference if needed. The Jesup Municipal Court sentences include but are not limited to fine payments, mandatory community service, DUI school attendance, and possible mandatory jail time. Disposition papers, fine payments, partial payment agreements, community service files, First Offender DUI affidavits, and Waiver of Rights affidavits are handled by the Jesup Police Department Clerk of Court Angie Ryals and secretary Tammy McArthur at the close of each session. The City of Jesup Police Department allows a payment plan to be set up for all eligible applicants who have received a fine from Judge Phelps. One third of a total fine sentenced is required to be paid the night of court. The balance is then set at a low monthly payment for the individual. 2011 ended with a total of \$287,471.71 collected from city court cases. These funds were broken down and distributed by the City of Jesup to various State fees and local funds as shown below.

## ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION

The Jesup Police Department Animal Control Officers are proud to be operating out of a newly renovated Animal Pound. Renovations on the building were completed July of 2011. A Feline Room was added and has been

equipped with eight (8) new cages to house any cats that are taken in. Dogs and cats are held in two separate rooms inside the building with no chance of contact with each other to help reduce the stress of the impounded animals. The Jesup Police Department Animal Control continues to handle all of Jesup and Wayne County; answering calls on a daily basis for removal of stray dogs and cats. They work diligently to remove animals as safely and humanely as possible and to ensure the safety of both officers and civilians on scene. In 2011 there were a total of 20 Dog Bite reports filed; five (5) Dog Bite reports involving individuals being bitten in the city and fifteen (15) Dog Bite reports in the County. A combined total of six (6) Cruelty to Animal cases were filed for 2011. Throughout the year the Jesup Police Department Animal Control answered a total 1,974 calls being divided as 639 calls for city and 1,335 calls for county. A total of 1,940 animals have been picked up by the Animal Control this year with 690 coming from inside the city limits and 1,250 from Wayne County. A total of 818 dogs and 561 cats have been euthanized this year. There were a total of 11 citations issued inside the city limits and 19 citations in the county for Animal Ordinance Violations



during 2011. Along with all of their day-to-day responsibilities Officer Manning and Officer Brown assisted City, County, and DNR Officers on animal and non-animal calls alike when needed.



The Jesup Police Department Animal Control has also been working diligently with A.R.F., Animal Refuge Foundation of Wayne County, to place appropriate dogs in temporary homes until they can be placed in permanent homes. Together the Animal Control and A.R.F. saved 137 dogs from euthanasia during 2011. A.R.F. also attended and assisted with Open House at the Pound in July.




## STATE CERTIFICATION

### GEORGIA LAW ENFORCEMENT CERTIFICATION PROGRAM



The Jesup Police Department State Certification Manager is Tammy McArthur. She is assisted by Captain Lawrence Moseley in maintaining department records for the State Certification Process. The Jesup Police Department has not reapplied for Certification due to non-compliance with certain State Certification Standards dealing with the building the Police Department is currently located in. Though we have not re-applied the Jesup Police Department is maintaining all Certification Records and handling all day-to-day operations to meet the requirements of State Certification as closely as possible. This is being done to ensure that our re-application will be made as smooth as possible and that the department continues to operate at its full potential. The Certification Program provides a comprehensive blueprint for effective & professional law enforcement. We are currently updating and maintaining files as per the 5<sup>th</sup> Edition Standards Manual released at the end of 2011 and is in full effect. Mandatory files have increased from 118 to 129 individual files with as many as eight (8) sub-sections to each folder that must contain at least two (2) documented proofs of compliance for the department for each year. Each Standard provides guidance to the correct way every facet of law enforcement should be handled by the agency to ensure the implementation of policies and procedures that are conceptually sound and operationally effective. During 2011 Corporal Ryals offered twelve (12) Seatbelt Safety Classes to the general public. There were a total of thirty-one attendees throughout the year; which is up from twenty-two attendees in 2010. Cpl. Ryals conducts a seatbelt safety seminar once a month to help educate the public on the hazards of not wearing a seatbelt. The classes are held in the evening time and last about an hour. Cpl. Ryals provides all attendees with educational material as

well as provides an informational video during the session. The classes are held free of charge to all who wish to attend. Ryals is a Child Safety Seat Installation Technician certified by Safe Kids World with curriculum by the National Highway Traffic Association. Cpl. Ryals continued to handle the Child Seat program for the Jesup Police Department. During a total of fifteen (15) child safety seats were donated to families in need by the Jesup Police Department and were installed by Cpl. Ryals. All child safety seat registrations that are installed by Cpl. Ryals are mailed from the Jesup Police Department in the event of a manufacturers' recall. Cpl. Ryals also assisted with Jesup/Wayne County's First Annual Safety Day by assisting with car seat installation along side Safe Kids of America.
